About the Role

Transform Rural India (TRI), in partnership with Maharashtra Village Social Transformation Foundation (MVSTF) under Mission Anandi, works with state and district health systems to strengthen early detection, referral, and continuum-of-care for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and priority cancers, improving screening coverage and enabling timely treatment.

The Programme Anchor – Public Health will lead district-level implementation of NCD and cancer screening interventions, ensuring effective programme delivery, stakeholder coordination, and quality assurance. The role includes managing block-level teams, supporting frontline workers, coordinating with district health authorities, and ensuring effective use of digital tracking systems.


Responsibilities

1. Programme implementation & service delivery

- Lead planning and execution of block and district-level screening campaigns for hypertension, diabetes and priority cancers (oral, breast, cervical) in alignment with NP- NCD and Mission Anandi
- Ensure smooth functioning of screening sites (PHC/CHC/HWCs), referral pathways to diagnostic centres and linkages to treatment/specialist facilities
- Oversee use and adoption of the digital patient/referral tracking platform; ensure data completeness and timeliness

2. Stakeholder engagement & government coordination

- Act as primary district liaison with District Administration, District Medical & Health Officer (DMHO), state NCD/Health mission units, and partner hospitals; negotiate service agreements and referral protocols.



- Convene and participate in district coordination forums, and community stakeholder meetings.

3. Human resources & capacity building

- Mentor and train/handhold frontline workers (ASHAs, ANMs, CHOs) on screening, early detection and referral protocols
- Coordinate refresher trainings and on-site supportive supervision to maintain quality standards

4. Quality assurance, monitoring & reporting

- Monitor service quality against clinical and programmatic standards; lead corrective action on quality issues, audits and incident reports
- Prepare monthly/quarterly programme reports, updates and contribute to impact assessments and learning documentation

5. Operations & resource management

- Coordinate with districts for programme logistics for screening camps and ensure availability of medicines/supplies for follow-up care
- Ensure compliance with safeguarding, data privacy, and organisational policies

6. Community mobilisation & behaviour change

- Drive demand generation and awareness campaigns with SHG-VO-CLF and PRI systems and local leaders to improve screening uptake and reduce delays to care

Knowledge/Skills

- Strong programme management and field implementation skills in public health programmes
- Experience working with government health systems and multiple stakeholders
- Familiarity with digital health platforms, monitoring systems, and reporting tools
- Strong coordination, communication, and problem-solving skills
- Ability to manage teams and work effectively in rural and field-based environments

Qualifications & Experiences

- Master's degree in Public Health, Health Management, Social Work, or related field; OR Nursing with public health experience
- 3-5 years of relevant experience in public health programme implementation, preferably in NCD or cancer screening programmes
- Experience working with district/state health departments and frontline health systems preferred
- Willingness to travel extensively and work in rural and remote areas
